

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,


who proceeds from the Father,



Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Gluten free wafers are available for those with wheat allergies. To receive the gluten free wafer, hold out your hands palms down. The person ministering the bread will then know to offer a gluten free wafer. Turn your palms up to receive.

Fall Means a Cozy Blanket: What if you didn't have one on the chilly nights ahead? We know that the saints in our church always step up when there is a need in the community. CARITAS provides a welcome home for those who need a hand up. But they also need blankets, quilts, and comforters. St. David's is hosting a collection for these items, new or in good condition starting now until the end of September. Boxes are in the coffee area. Last year was an overflowing success. Let's bless them with blankets etc. as we give thanks for all God has given us.—Joannie Smithson, Outreach

Kairos Cookies: Kairos Prison Ministries is in need of lots of cookies for an upcoming Kairos walk weekend from October 17 to 20. Please see the cookie guidelines below for more information about how to help.

- Cookie Preparation—The types of cookies that are generally acceptable are: Oatmeal, Peanut Butter, Molasses, Chocolate Chip, Ginger and Sugar. Cookies should be between 2 inches and 2-1/2 inches in diameter and not more than 1/2 inch thick. It is very important not to use icing, sugar or any other type of coating on the outside of the cookie. Do not add any kind of fruit or nuts to the cookies.
- Packing the Cookies—Bag thoroughly cooled cookies in a quart sized Zip Lock bag, a dozen cookies to a bag. Label each bag with the cookie type inside. Freeze all cookies if not using within 12 days.
- Cookies will need to be brought to the church no later than Wednesday, October 16.

Prayers: The Daughters of the King Chapter (The Women of the Cross) of St. David's want to support you in prayer. If you want us to pray for a specific person or need but do not want it added to the prayer list, you can email the daughters at dok@stdavidsrva.org.

Excuse me have we met?: It is helpful for everyone to wear nametags. The nametags are on the bulletin board near the front doors. If you don't have a nametag, email churchadmin@stdavidsrva.org and ask that we make one for you! If you prefer, we also have stick on nametags that you can fill in on the entry table in the narthex.

Mini-ministries: Would you like to get more involved in our church activities but not quite sure what yet?? Please think about these mini-ministries. They don't require training or much time.

- Choir do you enjoy singing??? Think about joining the choir at the 10am service. You don't need to read music, just have fun singing.
- Greeter greet people as they come in for services, hand out bulletins and welcome newcomers with info on our service.
- Host/Hostess provide simple coffee hour nibbles (nothing fancy) and act as a host for the brief get together after the 10am service. Great way to get to know people.

- Usher super easy! Take up the collection plate and usher people up to the Eucharist, hand out bulletins and take a count of attendance.
- Men's Shelter Meal help provide a dish for the meal, or deliver the meal downtown (food is simply dropped off), or provide other supplies needed for the meal
- Librarian to monitor and keep tidy the Little Free Library out back
- Lector read the Bible passages, and prayers during the services

Coffee Hour: Volunteers needed! We need people to sign up in the narthex to provide food for Coffee Hour after the 10am service. Hot and cold coffee, water and juice will be provided. If you have any questions, please contact the church office at churchadmin@stdavidsrva.org.

CCHASM and Little Free Pantry: Our ongoing ministries of CCHASM and our very own Little Free Pantry are dependent upon the food donations coming in on a regular basis. We keep the baskets in the entrance area for donated items and you are welcome to place items in them any time. We accept canned and packaged goods that are non-perishable. Any food that can be used to build a meal or packaged food that can be placed in the little pantry to help someone in need get through their day. The Little Pantry near the entrance of the parking lot is being regularly used now by our community and the CCHASM food pantry at Southminster Presbyterian is always in need of donations for those in our community who are experiencing financial stress and food insecurity. When looking at the problems of the world they can seem so overwhelming but we can work in our own neighborhood to make things better. Thanks everyone!!
